<p><b>Provide development assistance alongside emergency humanitarian aid.</b></p> <p>Even as South Sudan develops there will still be many vulnerable people who require humanitarian assistance.</p>	<p><b>Understand the impact of conflict.</b></p> <p>Make sure there's enough money to pay for security, people's protection and reforming the police and army.</p>	<p><b>Involve local communities.</b></p> <p>Encourage local people to take the lead in humanitarian aid and development. Make sure local organisations have access to the money they need.</p>
<p><b>Make sure help is fairly shared out.</b></p> <p>Support development in more stable areas of the country as well as in conflict affected areas.</p>	<p><b>Prioritise the most vulnerable people for assistance.</b></p> <p>Make sure that help goes to the people who need it most.</p>	<p><b>Prioritise help for small scale farmers and traders.</b></p> <p>Support farmers so they begin producing food again and support traders so that markets start working again.</p>
<p><b>Help to build essential services.</b></p> <p>Continue to support people's access to essential services such as clean water, sanitation, health and education.</p>	<p><b>Provide money at the right time.</b></p> <p>Make sure goods and aid are transported to remote areas during the dry season when more people can be reached by road. This will become much more difficult during the rainy season later in the year.</p>	<p><b>Make sure all the organisations working in South Sudan are working together as a team and know what each other is doing.</b></p>
