Show the world how **passionate, motivated and committed you are** to tackling Global Poverty by taking part in an exhibition that showcases your creativity, persuasiveness and ingenuity.

To produce this exhibition we need you to provide a creative response to one of the following questions.

- a. What is poverty?
- b. Why do we need to overcome extreme poverty and hunger (Millennium Development Goal 1)?
- c. How is climate change contributing to global poverty?

This could be anything - a collage, painting, illustrated story or poem, comic strip, drawing, or photograph. You can create a collection or combination of any of these, as long as they make sense as a whole, and can be displayed on a jigsaw piece. We will put the jigsaw pieces together as one whole jigsaw puzzle on the day of the conference.

As this will be **your school's official message as part of the Oxfam conferences** you need to speak to as many of your classmates and peers as possible before you start.

All exhibition pieces must be brought to the conference.

Criteria

- All exhibition pieces should clearly and creatively depict a response to one of the questions posed
- Student's names and school must be written somewhere on the puzzle piece (back or front) along with a caption or title (max 15 words), that outlines the meaning/intention of the piece or helps convey its message.

Terms & conditions

- The written permission of any individuals who are identifiable in the photographs must be obtained before pieces are submitted
- It must be your own original work
- Exhibition pieces must demonstrate respect for others, should not contain swearing and must be within the law
- Images may be digitally enhanced, altered, superimposed etc. to communicate desired message – imaginative use of images is encouraged
- By taking part in the exhibition, you agree to allow Oxfam non-exclusive rights to use the images for educational and campaigning purposes.
